Parents and Teachers Collaborate for Student Success



Cyberbullying: A Growing Challenge

With the rise of technology, cyberbullying has

become a significant issue for students and families. It involves using social media, messaging apps, websites, and other online platforms to send abusive messages, spread harmful rumours, or



exclude others. Cyberbullies may also impersonate someone online or misuse their login details.

COMMON FORMS OF CYBERBULLYING:

- Teasing or mocking someone online, causing emotional distress.
- Spreading rumours or false information.
- Repeatedly sending unwanted messages.
- Damaging a person's reputation by sharing untrue statements.
- Cyberbullying can affect anyone, and the anonymity of the internet often emboldens bullies. It can involve individuals or groups, such as classmates or online communities.

HOW CYBERBULLYING DIFFERS FROM TRADITIONAL BULLYING

While traditional bullying is well-known, cyberbullying introduces new challenges due to the nature of technology:





INVASION OF PERSONAL SPACE: Cyberbullying can occur 24/7, invading a student's personal space at home or school.

WIDER AUDIENCE: Online messages can quickly reach a large audience, making it difficult to control the spread of harmful content.

ANONYMITY: Cyberbullies often hide behind fake profiles, making it harder for victims to identify their harassers.



UNINTENTIONAL HARM: Sometimes, cyberbullying occurs unintentionally when someone fails to consider the impact of their online actions.

THE LINK BETWEEN CYBER ADDICTION AND CYBERBULLYING

Excessive internet use increases exposure to cyberrelated issues, including cyberbullying, online gaming addiction, and cyber grooming.

TIPS FOR KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE ONLINE:

- Parents should be aware of the content their children access online.
- Use parental control apps to monitor and block inappropriate content.
- Stay informed about the latest online trends and risks.
- Schools should educate students about cyber security.
- Parents should talk to their children about online safety and its associated risks.

EMOTIONAL IMPACT OF CYBERBULLYING

Victims of cyberbullying often feel ashamed, anxious, and insecure, leading to withdrawal from friends and family. This can result in negative thoughts, isolation, and a decline in mental health. In some cases, victims may skip school, turn to substance abuse, or engage in violent behaviour.

Seeking help from a trusted friend, family member, or school counsellor is crucial.

REPORTING CYBERBULLYING

The National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal in India allows victims to report cybercrimes, including those targeting women and children. This portal provides law enforcement with the information needed to address the issue.

Both face-to-face bullying and cyberbullying leave lasting effects, but cyberbullying also leaves a digital footprint that can be used as evidence. Everyone has the right to justice, and offenders should be held accountable.

Remember, treat others online as you would in person. Follow the Golden Rule: Be kind in online and offline interactions.
