



GOLDEN JUBILEE CELEBRATION OF GOOD SHEPHERD HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL, JONGKSHA

"Preparing students for academic excellence and evolving them to be great human beings is the purpose of education," said Conrad K. Sangma, honourable Chief Minister of Meghalaya, while addressing the Golden Jubilee function of Good Shepherd Higher Secondary School, Jongksha, East Khasi Hills. The Chief Minister congratulated the school for their dedicated five-decade service in 'educating the heart and mind' of thousands of students. On this occasion, the Chief Minister inaugurated the Jubilee higher secondary block with modern science labs. He also inaugurated the Atal Tinkering Lab of the school.



Minister for Sports and Youth Affairs, Banteidor Lyngdoh, Executive member of KHADC, Martle Mukhim, Provincial Superior of Holy Cross Fathers, Fr. Simon Fernandis, CSC, and Alumni member and journalist, Rining Lyngdoh spoke on the occasion and congratulated the school for having rendered 50 years of service in imparting quality education to the youth of the area.

Fr. George Jacob, CSC principal of the school, in his address, appreciated the visionary leaders of the



past and present, staff and students of the school for their commitment to the education and recommitted to inspiring many more students and preparing them for the future. On the occasion, the school students performed various cultural items to the delight of parents, friends, and well-wishers of the school.

The history of Good Shepherd Higher Secondary School, Jongksha, commenced in 1945 with establishing a Lower Primary School by the Catholic Mission, Shillong. However, the leap for the Educational Mission of the Catholic Church took place with the establishment of Good Shepherd Parish in 1972 by the Salesians of Don Bosco. In a certain sense, the beginning of Good Shepherd School began in the same year with the opening of Class IV and the Middle English School. From then, the school started to function more systematically and earnestly with nine students and five teachers!

In 1977, the Congregation of Holy Cross took responsibility for the Parish and the fledging School. The efforts of the Congregation of Holy Cross were in collaboration with the Franciscan Sisters of the Most Blessed Sacrament till 2004 and from there on with the Congregation of the Sisters of the Little Flower of Bethany. What began as a tiny seed in 1972 with nine students and five teachers has grown into a big tree with 850 students, 33 teachers, and five non-teaching staff.

Tripura region: On 11th March 2022, all heads of schools under the Holy Cross Educational




Foundation gathered to discuss and plan for the upcoming academic year. We discussed varied subjects affecting our schools. Fr. Simon Fernandis,

Eucharistic Procession: The Annual Eucharistic procession of Holy Cross Parish, Mawkynrew, Meghalaya, held on the 30th of January 2022, was a long-awaited one earmarked for the faith journey in the parish. The newly built church dedicated to St. Paul at Jatah Lakadong was also inaugurated and blessed on the same day. It was a solemn event for the people of the parish to witness the second biggest church of the parish in this village. The church was inaugurated by Fr. Simon Fernandis, CSC, the provincial superior of Holy Cross Fathers, North East India. Most. Rev. Victor Lyngdoh, DD, the Archbishop of Shillong, blessed the church and officiated the solemn Eucharist, which 15 priests concelebrated. During the Eucharist, 450 people received the sacrament of Confirmation, and 270 children received the First Holy Communion. In the afternoon Eucharistic procession took place through the streets and by-lanes of Jatah village with people singing hymns and adoring the Eucharistic Lord.

Blessing of the Village Chapel: On the 06th of February 2022, another newly built church dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus at Mawlat village of our parish was inaugurated by Fr. MINISTERIAL EXPERIENCE

MY EXPERIENCE AT CATHEDRAL HIGH SCHOOL IN INDIANAPOLIS

At the very outset, I congratulate the Provincial Council and the editorial team of "Waves" for reviving the publication of our Province Newsletter. It will certainly keep us all informed and in touch with each other. I take this opportunity to write a few lines about my life and ministry at Cathedral High School in Indianapolis. As you know, I am here in response to the invitation of the Provincial of the

Midwest Province of Holy Cross Brothers to collaborate in their educational ministry. I arrived here on August 2 2021, when the second wave of Covid-19 was at its peak. Unfortunately, I got infected with Covid while quarantining at a Hotel in Mexico City on my way to Indianapolis. I came here with acute Pneumonia and was physically very weak and hardly able to walk. Thanks to the care I received from Brother Roberto and other Holy Cross confreres in the area, I survived with a few days of hospitalization and good nursing care at Columba Hall at Notre Dame University. I began my ministry as the school chaplain after a whole month of complete bed rest and medical treatment. My duties at the school are priestly and sacramental (Holy Mass, Confessions, Adorations, Retreats, anointing of the sick) and helping with the school's counselling department and the campus ministry team as and when needed. Thanks be to God; I am finding joy and fulfilment in my priestly ministry.

Let me give you a short introduction about the



school where I do my ministry. Cathedral High School was founded as an all-boys Catholic high school on September 13, 1918, by Bishop Joseph Chartrand. The Indianapolis Catholic Diocese owned Cathedral but engaged the Holy Cross Brothers of the Midwest Province to serve as faculty by a unique arrangement. Under the Brothers of Holy Cross, Cathedral's reputation as an outstanding academic institution grew, and so did the enrolment. By the early 1950s, Cathedral was overflowing. In 1964, the ownership of the school was handed over to the Brothers of Holy Cross by the Diocese.

From 1964 to 1972, the Holy Cross Brothers ran Cathedral as a private, independent school. One of the most significant results of "independence" was that the Cathedral no longer received financial



support from the church -- and that remains true today. Because of declining enrolments and radically shifting population patterns to the suburbs, the Brothers were convinced by 1972 that the continued operation of Cathedral was not feasible.

In October of that year, the Holy Cross Brothers announced Cathedral would close, effective June 1973.

A group of parents, alumni and friends rescued Cathedral by forming a non-profit organization to take over the school. In 1976, the Cathedral Trustees moved their school to its present location and girls were included in the Cathedral student body for the first time. In 1988, 2004 and again in 2016, Cathedral was recognized by the U.S. Department of Education as a "School of Excellence."

Today, Cathedral is experiencing continued growth and popularity. There are approximately 1,200 students in Grades 9-12 and more than 100 faculty and staff members, most of whom hold Master's degrees or higher. The school offers diverse co-curricular activities in academic, cultural and athletic disciplines. Students hail from more than 100 elementary and middle schools and 13 counties throughout central Indiana. On September 13, 2018, Cathedral High School celebrated 100 years of educational service to young people in central Indiana. Brother Roberto Jimenez, CSC and yours truly are the only CSCs in the school. The school imparts to its students the core values of the Holy Cross, and it is no doubt very Holy Cross and very Catholic.
